The 23rd International Conference on Magnetism (ICM 2027) is sponsored jointly by AIP Publishing and the IEEE Magnetics Society, with support from The International Union of Pure and Applied Physics (IUPAP). ICM is a major international conference series covering both fundamental and applied research related to magnetism and is held every three years. ICM 2027 will be held June 14-18, 2027 at the Puerto Rico Convention Center in beautiful San Juan, Puerto Rico.

On behalf of the Management Committee of ICM 2027, we cordially invite you to attend the Conference and actively participate in its technical sessions, and by doing so to contribute to the continued success of the ICM series. ICM 2027 provides an opportunity for you to share your research with the largest and broadest collection of magnetism researchers assembled in one place, and to learn about the most recent developments in the field. Conference Program

The program will include five plenary lectures, semi-plenary, invited and contributed oral presentations, and poster sessions. The Sunday before the actual program will include magnetism related tutorials.

Call for Proposals for Invited Presentations and Symposia

Invited Presentations and Symposia are an important aspect of ICM 2027. Starting on July 20, 2026, we are soliciting proposals from the magnetics community. The deadline for proposal submission is September 7, 2026.

Abstract Submission

Abstract submission will open on October 1, 2026. The deadline for abstract submission (November 13, 2026) will be strictly observed. All abstracts must be submitted online at <https://icm2027.abstractcentral.com>. Abstracts sent via e-mail or regular mail will not be processed or acknowledged. Details about the format are posted on the <https://icm2027.org/abstract-submissions>. Authors will be informed of the status of their submission via e-mail by December 21, 2026. Most contributions will be presented as posters in sessions that will not compete with other activities.

SUBMIT NOMINATION



Technical Presentations

Contributed papers accepted for the Conference will be presented either as oral presentations or posters, with the majority being posters. Authors should indicate on the submission form if they are willing to present in either form, only as a poster, or only as an oral. The Program Committee will make the final decision on the assignment of papers to sessions and the presentation format for each session.

Contributed oral presentations will be in the format of a 12-minute talk by a registered author, followed by a 3-minute discussion period. Authors are expected to bring their presentations on their own laptop along with a backup copy on a USB drive.

Poster presentations will consist of well-prepared visual materials about the work posted on a designated board, with the author available to provide details and answer questions during the selected poster sessions. Simply posting a copy of the paper is inappropriate and will be marked as a NO SHOW. Additional presentation instructions will be available on the Conference website.

Publications

We encourage authors of papers presented at the Conference to consider publishing in the Conference-related issues of the *IEEE Transactions on Magnetics* and *AIP Advances*. The editorial process for the manuscripts will meet the same standards required for regular submissions to the two journals. Papers will be assigned to a journal based on their subject area. We are not able to accommodate individual author preferences for publication journal.

Best Poster Presentations

At each of the poster sessions, judges will select best posters. Selections will be based on the level of the research, quality of the poster, and clarity of the presentation. The winning posters will be displayed for the rest of the meeting and the winning presenter will be given a unique commemorative trophy and certificate.

Visa Requirements

Puerto Rico follows the same entry rules as the mainland U.S. If you need a visa to enter the U.S., you'll need one for Puerto Rico too. Obtaining your visa to enter Puerto Rico may take several months. Applicants should consult the U.S. Department of State's website to determine first if you need a visa or visa renewal, to schedule an appointment for an interview and to determine processing wait times. To request a letter of invitation from the Conference, complete the online form at <https://icm2027.org/travel/visa-entry-information>. You must be either a registered Conference attendee or have submitted an abstract in order to receive an invitation letter.

All nationals and citizens of Visa Waiver Program (VWP) countries who plan to travel to Puerto Rico for temporary business or pleasure for 90 days or less are required by law to obtain travel authorization prior to travel to the U.S. This authorization can be obtained online through the Electronic System for Travel Authorization (ESTA).
